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### 2009 Critical Care Nutrition Guidelines

The Clinical Practice Guidelines are a set of 209 randomized controlled trials in the area of critical care nutrition. All the guideline topics have undergone a formal review process and were last updated in January 2009 and May 2009 (as indicated in red). The 2009 update added 40 new randomized controlled trials to the evidence-based guidelines.

In February, the Society of Critical Care Medicine (SCCM) and the American Society for Parenteral and Enteral Nutrition (ASPEN) released an update to the 2009 nutrition guidelines for critically ill patients.<sup>1</sup> Nutrition support clinicians have been awaiting the new guidelines, which were published in the Journal of Parenteral & Enteral Nutrition.

### New Guidelines on Nutrition Support for the Critically Ill

The Canadian Critical Care Practice Guidelines (CCPGs) were first published in 2003 and are among the most regularly updated evidence-based guidelines, with updates in 2005, 2007, 2009 and 2013. The 2013 CCPGs summarize the evidence from approximately 300 randomized controlled trials in the area of critical care nutrition since 1980.

### **A summary for Adult Critically Ill Patients**

For patients with a BMI <30, protein requirements should be in the range of 1.2-2.0 gm/kg actual body weight. For patients with a BMI >30, protein requirements should be in the range of 1.2-2.0 gm/kg/day of adjusted body weight. b.
