The body of the flag is to be Dark Blue (Pantone 289U). As in the case of the Tennessee State flag, a six inch crimson bar (Pantone 186U) on the end farthest from the halyard relieves the sameness of the blue field and prevents the flag from showing too much blue when hanging limp.
